5. SLINGS, SUB-MACHINE GUN, WEB.

Webbing slings for S.M.G.'s have been accepted into the Service. These slings, which are 57-inches in length, enable the gun to be held in a better position when fired from the hip than the shorter rifle sling which was originally used. Owen, Austen, and Thompson Sub-Machine Guns will be equipped with these slings.

The following Plates give some idea as to the methods of use :-

Plate 3-Carrying position. Sling over right shoulder.

Plate 4—Sling over left shoulder. Fired by one hand. Other hand free to allow opening of doors, moving obstacles, etc.



PLATE 3-Sling S.M.G. Web (Carrying Position).

Plate 5—Gun controlled by one hand only, leaving the other free for aid in climbing obstacles, etc.

Plate 6-Carrying position. Sling can be across right shoulder.

Plate 7—Fire position from carrying position. Sling across right shoulder. Choice of sling position is left to the firer.

Plate 8-Firing position from carrying position.
